EP Elections action plan

CONCORD Board decided to support the idea of Hub 4 to focus on the EP elections and establish a comprehensive action plan for CONCORD to properly engage into this process at European and national levels and enable all members of the Confederation to act if they want around the EP elections. The actions will cover 2018 and 2019.

What happened so far: Hub 4 initiated this process, the Board approved it and enlarged the action to the whole constituency. A survey for all CONCORD members have been disseminated to map our needs and make sure that the action plan will include promote clear objectives and outcomes that will be useful for every CONCORD member (and will be used by your members too at national and local level). A broad group has been set up

What will happen at the GA: members of CONCORD will have a better understanding of what they can do together around the elections (at European and national level) and of how to best join forces to make a bigger impact. Also, challenges will be highlighted with hopefully possible solutions to tackle them. Some action-points will be clarified and plans for 2018 and 2019 will be tailored.

The six tables of discussion will focus on:

- Communication / tools / public campaigning
- Linkages with national level + connection with national elections
- Topics and Aims
- Wider alliances & other CSO groups working on elections - how to join forces?
- Advocacy around elections
- Resources- what can we do together?

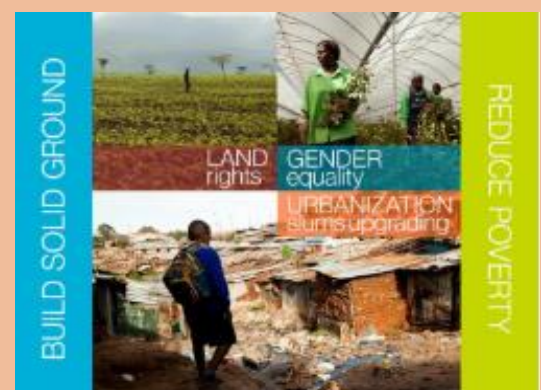


Build Solid Groud Project

"Developing Capacities Together: European CSO-University networks for global learning on migration, security and sustainable development in an interconnected world - InterCap", is a 3-year project (from Nov 2017 to Oct 2020) funded by EuropeAid envisaging to address the emerging concern on the way in which shifting public perceptions of (in) security and risk, influence understanding of migration, sustainable development, roles, responsibilities and lifestyles of EU citizens in an interdependent world. In this direction, InterCap brings together 13 organizations from 12 different EU countries specialized in teachers' training, educational reform, sustainable development and migration issues, along with more than 40 associates from all over EU (local authorities, Ministries, Universities, and CSOs). The Action's priority is to establish European CSOs-university networks, to build the capacities of the education actors, to promote global learning on migration, security and sustainable development in an interdependent world. InterCap is led by CARDET (Cyprus).
